Sticky Knowledge

Genesis 2 is an aetiology that teaches God is good, humans are special, and people are stewards of creation.

Christians believe original sin damaged humanity's relationship with God, others and creation.

In John's Gospel, Jesus is the Word of God made human, bringing salvation and restoring humanity's relationship with God.

The Nicene Creed summarises Christian beliefs about the Trinity, salvation and Baptism. Christians use it as a prayer to help guide how they live out their faith.

In Laudato Si', Pope Francis teaches that Christians must care for creation and repair damaged relationships.

Georges Lemaître, a Catholic priest and scientist, developed the Big Bang theory, showing that faith and science can work together.
